II. The Process of Bible Study

A. Step one: Observation – "What do I see?"

There are four basic things to notice:

1. Terms

Terms – Terms are more than just words. Terms have specific <u>meaning</u> based on their _____.

2. Structure

- a. Grammatical structure tells us important information like subject, verb, etc.
- b. Literary structure reveals clues through recognition of things like questions and answers; cause and effect; etc.
- 3. Literary form (______) Are we looking at poetry, prophecy, history, narrative, etc.?
- 4. Atmosphere Tells us the feelings, mood, tone, environment, etc. What was it like to be in the author's shoes?

B. Step two: Interpretation – "What does it mean?"

There are three things that will aid us in the discovery of the meaning of a passage.

- 1. Bombard the text with ______. The Bible is never embarrassed to be asked honest questions.
- 2. Look for the answers. These most often will come out of our observation process.
- 3. Integrate the parts and put them together. Put all the details together into a meaningful whole.

The more time you spend in observation, the less time you will spend in interpretation, and the more faithful you will be to God's word.
